A Taste of Rome - 9 hours and 30 minutes

This tour is designed for guests who would like a limited guided tour with free time to explore Rome at leisure. Once in Rome, you will be dropped off at a designated point to explore or shop on your own and have fun in the Eternal City. The guide will advise you at what time to meet again to continue the tour.

Visit the highlights of the Vatican City; St. Peter's Basilica, one of Christendom's most significant churches. Inside view Michelangelo's "Pieta" and the 85-foot-high Bernini Pulpit.

At St. Peter's In Chains Cathedral, you can admire one of the many masterpieces created by Michelangelo, the famous statue of Moses. Continue by walking to the Roman Colosseum, one of the most important monuments of ancient Rome. Re-board the bus for the drive back to the ship.

An escort will be on the coach during the trip to/from Rome and a local guide will be met once in Rome for the half day guided portion of the tour.



City of Lisbon - 4 hours



Portugal's capital is an 18th century city and in 1755, a great earthquake destroyed the city. In the old Moorish section, which survived the quake, there are still remains of pre-quake Lisbon.

You will begin your visit with a photo stop in the Belem District that is famous for its landmark tower on the bank of the Tagus River, from where many explorers embarked on their voyages of discovery. You will continue to the Monument of the Discoveries, a slab of concrete jutting out from the Tagus riverbank, erected in 1960 to commemorate the 500th anniversary of the death of Henry the Navigator. The Jeronimos Monastery Church is a 16th century architectural masterpiece designed in Gothic Manueline style.

Lisbon is a hilly city paved with cobblestones offering magnificent views, especially from Alto Do Parque Belvedere. Rossio Square, in the heart of the city, is one of the busiest. From there the mile-long Avenida de Liberdade leads to the statue of Pombal who re-planned the city after the earthquake. You will visit the Alfama, the oldest part of Lisbon, for a quick walk through its cobbled labyrinth of narrow twisting alleys, honeycombed with steps and archways.

On the return drive to the ship, see the April 25th Bridge, sister to the Golden Gate Bridge, stretching across the River Tagus and the towering statue of Christ the King on the far bank.

Arcos de la Frontera - Seville (Cadiz), Spain - 5 hours and 30 minutes



Arcos sits along a ridgeline above the impressive cliff, Pena Nueva, overlooking the winding Guadalete River and its broad valley. The opposite side of the ridge, Pena Vieja, overlooks Lago de Arcos. The old town center sits at the highest point, with steep, narrow streets of whitewashed homes cascading down the ridgeline. Motor traffic flows only west to east into the old town, and then loops back, leaving the town's labyrinth to be explored peacefully on foot. Your guide will point out the most important venues in the village such as the Plaza

Cabildo for you to peer from the plaza's open north side down onto the golden cliffs and out across the river plain. Visit the Church of San Pedro, an added gothic work of the 14th century with baroque of the XVIII (the facade and the tower).
