A Day in Stockholm - 6 hours

A tour that covers all the main sights and the whole city of Stockholm with the districts of Sodermalm, Gamla Stan, Norrmalm, Kungsholmen, Ostermalm and Djurgarden each with its own special character. Visit the Vasa, once considered to be one of the world's largest and most prestigious warships. The museum is built around the 17th century warship, which sank in Stockholm's inner harbour on her maiden voyage in 1628. Salvaged in 1961 and today restored to much of its former glory, the Vasa represents an authentic piece of living history.



Continue through Ostermalm, before reaching Stockholm's oldest quarter, the Old Town. Here you will have an opportunity to experience Stockholm on your own before meeting up with your guide again for a guided walk through the Old Town. Witness the historic elegance of the exterior of the dominating Royal Palace and the Cathedral, dating back to the 13th century. Visit the Cathedral, the city's oldest church and the coronation site of most of Sweden's Kings. The exterior reveals little of the beauty of its late Gothic interior. Here you will find one of the oldest and most known sculptures in Northern Europe, St. George and the Dragon dating back to 1489 and symbolising Sweden's struggles to break free of Denmark. At Stortorget, the Great Square, you will see the Old Stock Exchange, now home of the Swedish Academy and the Nobel Museum before returning to your coach for the drive back to the pier.

Best of Tallinn with Concert & Lunch - 6 hours

This comprehensive tour starts by an inside visit to The Song Festival Ground. A stop here will give you an impression of the enormous Song Festivals that are held every five years on this site, with up to 30,000 performers singing. A short drive follows to Tallinn's Upper Old Town, where you will pass ancient walls and tower gateways and disembark the coach at Tall Hermann Tower. Walk up the short distance to Palace Square where you will view the baroque Toompea Castle, now the residence of the Estonian Parliament and visit the lovely Russian Orthodox Alexander Nevski Cathedral, a dominating feature of Upper Town's city skyline. From here continue along Tallinn's old cobbled streets to visit the Gothic St Mary's Cathedral. Proceed to the scenic viewpoint over the Lower Town rooftops, where you will have an opportunity to shop at the small shops.



Next descend to the Town Hall Square in the Lower Old Town where free time is given to view the Gothic Town Hall. There, in one of Tallinn's typical Old Town restaurants lunch will be served. A special visit to a medieval building is accompanied by a concert of old music. You will continue to Catherine's Passage where free time is allotted for a shopping opportunity at the craft workshops, where glass, leather, millinery and ceramic wares can be seen in production and purchased, before returning to the ship.

Charming Copenhagen - Walk & Cruise - 4 hours

The best way to learn and experience the atmosphere of Copenhagen city is to do it by walking and by water. Commence the tour by following the harbor front passing the Langelinie Yacht Marina. Stop at the world famous Little Mermaid which has become a symbol of Denmark. Stroll along the green park and harbour and continue to the modern, but elegant Amaliegarden, with the Queen's Palace, Amalienborg right behind the square. Near the Amalienborg Palace you will come to the Nyhavn canals, once the sailors' quarter, but today is a fashionable promenade with restaurants and bars. On the way to Nyhavn a stop at Odd Fellow Palace is made. Cross the King's New Square where the Royal Theatre is located and proceed into the medieval Copenhagen where the cobblestone streets, half-timbered houses, and narrow courtyards are still dominating - but carefully restored. On your way pass by the Christiansborg Castle, housing the Danish Government, before strolling into the cosy narrow pedestrian streets again. At Gammel Strand you board one of our lovely canal boats. The leisurely cruise takes you through the canals of Christianshavn with its picturesque old buildings and Our Saviour's Church with its green and gold steeple, The Black Diamond - the new wing of the Royal Library and other landmarks before making a stop at the original location of the Little Mermaid, the fairytale creation of Hans Christian Andersen before returning to the ship.
